No matter what. Even when it's hard. Even when you don't feel like it. Just keep going. The more you create, the better you will become. And the more likely you are to achieve your goals.


So there you have it. 10 things nobody told me about being creative. I hope this advice helps you on your own creative journey. And remember, the

most important thing is to just keep creating.


