




Diagram of the alchemical process



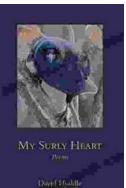

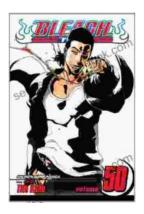
